Supervisor Harris called the May 13, 2021 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

#### **Review of Resolutions**

S. Harris summarized the resolutions on the agenda. He stated that resolutions 2021-141 and 2021-143 would be withdrawn as more information was needed for each. With respect to resolution 2021-144, he noted some information had been omitted on a previous resolution for the Chief. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

S. Harris commended S. Golden, Youth Director, for her efforts to add the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) program which will be part of the Schodack Town Park events for the Summer Youth Camp (2021-149).

P. Harter noted the 2019 Audit would be conducted and finalized by the Bonadio Group as it was delayed in 2020 due to the COVID-19 Pandemic (2021-151). He reminded the board that a questionnaire relating to the audit had been sent to each member to be completed and returned to the Bonadio Group as soon as possible.

**Board Comment:** S. Harris asked P. Harter if there was anything noteworthy on the abstracts (2021-153 & 2021-154). P. Harter said the abstract amounts were slightly lower due to principal payments for the month of April.

**Public Comment:** S. Harris asked the town clerk if any public comment had been received via email. She said no. He also asked anyone in the audience if they would like to speak. All declined.

**Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments:** The Board reviewed claims #21-0652 to #21-0851 on Abstract No. 2021-05 in the amount of \$416,525.70 including the claims paid prior (\$251,858.68).

**Departmental Reports:** The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Building Department, Historian, Town Clerk and Tax Receiver.

### Public Hearing Proposed Local Law 2-2021 Planned Development District – Route 9 Business Park

S. Harris called the public hearing for proposed local law #2-2021 to order at 7:07 p.m.

The Town Clerk summarized the Affidavit of Publication seeking public comment on the adoption of proposed Local Law No. 2 of 2021 amending the Town of Schodack Zoning Code and creating a new Planned Development District, PD-2, known as the RTE 9 Business Park, with respect to a portion of lands now or previously owned by Donald Hart & Hartland Associates Inc., on the tract or parcel of land located at U.S. Route 9, in the Town of Schodack, Tax Map No. 200.-9-32.1. The legal notice was posted on the Town Clerk's signboard, the Town's website and published in *The Record* on May 3, 2021. The Town Clerk added that there was no public comment received via email regarding the public hearing.

S. Hart of Hart Engineering said he was continuing to work with the Planning Department and Laberge Engineering regarding the project and noted that he would be utilizing the original layout of the 25-acre site with three to five building lots. He added that two parcels were already confirmed with businesses including Trojan Energy Systems and Dibble Equipment.

S. Harris asked for any in-person public comment or board comment. None were received.

Hearing no comments, S. Harris made a motion to close the public hearing at 7:13 p.m., seconded by C. Rex. 5 Ayes 0 Noes. **MOTION CARRIED.** Ayes – J. Bult, M. Kenney, S. Swartz, T. Rex, D. Harris. Noes – 0.

### **Presentations**

J. Muscato of Young/Sommer LLC explained that the project he represented, Greendale Solar Farm, was seeking a zoning change from a PD-1 to a PD-2 to allow for the installation of the Solar Farm off Route 32. The farm would be located between Rensselaer and Columbia Counties within the Towns of Kinderhook and Schodack. He noted that all panels would be located within the Town of Schodack. With the project being in two different towns and counties, the applicant was required to gain permission from all four localities for construction. He said the application for the Town of Schodack had been submitted to the Planning Board in January and was followed by a Negative Declaration determination under SEQRA. An application was also submitted with the Town of Kinderhook Planning Board and was moving forward with no opposition. In order for the project to be eligible for block grants

under NYSERDA, the project would need to be fully approved, including the 239-m referrals from each County Planning Board, by June.

C. Swartz expressed concern regarding the location of the access road. The location would be on a dangerous pull-out onto Route 9 in Columbia County. He asked if NYS DOT had been consulted. G. Maruca of Eden Renewables said the Kinderhook Planning Board presented the same concern and the road is being reviewed by NYS DOT.

#### Open Discussion

**Sewer District #5 Income Survey:** S. Harris informed the board that a letter, which would accompany the income survey to residents of the East Schodack Sewer District, had been drafted by G&G Municipal Consulting and needed approval. A copy was forwarded to each board member for review.
