S. Peter said it was with great sadness that he announces the passing of Martha Sherwood. He noted the rich history of residents monitoring town government, for the good, with one of those residents being Ms. Sherwood. He asked all in attendance to join him in a moment of silence.

#### **Brief of Resolutions**

S. Peter gave a brief overview of all resolutions on the agenda. He noted that resolutions 2022-078 and 2022-079 amended previous resolutions, resolution 2022-080 authorized the Human Resources Manager to post the position of Sole Assessor upon the retirement of Karen Justus and Frank Curtis would be appointed to the position of Temporary Assessor per resolution 2022-083. He added that an amendment would be made to 2022-083 to

include "for a period not to exceed 6 months" and strike out "NYS Department of Taxation and Finance". He thanked Karen Justus for her many years of service and Mr. Curtis for lending his experience to the town while they sought her replacement.

Board Comment (Resolutions): None.

#### **Public Comment (Resolutions)**

Resolution 2022-081: E. Hyde Clarke of Young Sommers LLC explained that an amendment to the PD-2 zoning had been approved by local law for Greendale Solar in May 2021; however, an issue arose with the site having a setback of less than 200 feet. As town code stated, the solar array must be a minimum of 200 feet from the utility corridor located at the rear of the property. The Building Inspector was asked for a letter of interpretation which would allow the array to be closer to the utility corridor but based upon the code, he was unable to so. The project was referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals to apply for a variance of 100 feet and was approved. Based upon the change, a new public hearing and local law was required for the PD-2 designation. Atty. Langlois asked Mr. Clarke if he had an updated draft of proposed local law 1-2022. Mr. Clarke said yes, a copy had been forwarded to the Supervisor's Secretary, which included repealing Local Law 3-2021. He recommended that the board review the solar law and consider amending the 200-foot setback regarding utility corridors as it would be beneficial to have the array closer to the utility lines that it would be supplying. C. Swartz agreed.

**Departmental Reports:** The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Building Department, Historian, Receiver of Taxes and Town Clerk.

**Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments:** The Board reviewed claims #21-2241 to 21-2256 and #22-0001 to 22-0111 on Abstract No. 2022-01, in the amount of \$397,505.91, including the claims paid (\$33,767.58) since the previous town board meeting.

#### Public Comment (Open)

P. Cartwright, Vice President of the Castleton Library, explained that, based upon the 2021 Annual Report, the library loaned materials consisted of 72% physical items such as books, magazines and DVDs and 28% digital media including eBooks and eAudiobooks. He was pleased to announce that the library saw an increase in attendance of more than five percent in 2021 and was awarded the designation as a three-star library, by Library Journal, for the second year in a row. He noted that the Library Wi-fi, which is accessible both inside the library and outside in the parking lot, saw an almost 50% increase in use for 2021. Two programs that had been established in 2021 which were experiencing great success were the story time walk at the Schodack Island State Park and the quarterly tech outreach program at the Castle Hill Senior Housing.
