Supervisor Peter called the February 10, 2022 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

Briefing of the Resolutions

S. Peter gave a brief overview of the resolutions. He noted that candidates had been interviewed for the Building Inspector position; however, further discussion was needed between the board. Therefore, resolution 2022-102 would be withdrawn. With respect to resolution 2022-104, an amendment was needed to accommodate for a supply chain issue and new supplier for the server at Police Department. The Supervisor explained that a letter of resignation had been received from Maggie Banker, Dog Control Officer earlier in the week; however, after a brief meeting, she rescinded said resignation. It was proposed that a leave of absence be granted to Mrs. Banker (resolution 2022-109) and appoint Bob Guyer as the Temporary Dog Control Officer to serve the town in the interim (resolution 2022-105). As a leave of absence was proposed, he stated that resolution 2022-106 would be withdrawn. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

Departmental Reports: The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Building Department, Historian, Receiver of Taxes and Town Clerk.

Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments: The Board reviewed claims #22-0112 to #22-0298 on Abstract No. 2022-02 in the amount of \$2,379,319.93, including the claims paid prior (\$107,609.65).

Board Comment

Resolution 2022-101: S. Peter noted that a small parade would be held to honor Marjorie on her birthday. A copy of the proclamation would be presented to her at that time.

WHEREAS, Rensselaer County Bureau of Finance is responsible for entering the credit on the tax roll, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 626, the TWC/Charter Tax Department returned the Town's Special Franchise tax bill, and

WHEREAS, TWC/Charter is required to make a request in order to receive a credit on the tax roll, and

WHEREAS, the Town has received a request for the credit on property taxes assessed in 2020 from the franchise fees paid during 2021,
