C. Bult asked that the end of Schuurman Road be considered for the remaining road budget. S. Peter agreed and said he had spoken to B. Brahm, Interim Highway Superintendent, regarding prices for the end of Schuurman Road as well as the Town Hall Parking Lot. S. Peter stated that it was the consensus of the board to appoint William Morgan as Sole Assessor, effective June 6, 2022 at a salary of \$52,000.00 (2022-194) and Carl Ashby as part-time Park Attendant (2022-195). For resolutions 2022-197 to 2022-199, S. Peter asked the Comptroller if there were any issues with the audits conducted. P. Harter said all internal controls for the departments were ideal; however, two departments had an issue with petty cash. One had inherited a fund that was short, and another had an overage. A transfer of funds would be conducted for the department with the shortage to make the fund whole. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

Open Discussion

Book Donation Bin - Transfer Station: S. Peter explained that B. He asked the board to submit names of candidates to fill the position for 2023.

Per the recommendation of all town board members, the Ethics Board would consist of five members. Atty. Langlois noted that the terms of the members would need to be staggered.
