Supervisor Dowds called the August 11, 2016 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above. Attorney Gruenberg was absent.

Presentation: Library Services

Jill Dugas Hughes (Director, East Greenbush Community Library) and Melissa Tacke (Director, Castleton Public Library) gave a presentation to outline the plan for the 2017 budget. Ms. Dugas Hughes opened by stating they plan to make improvements to the library services that benefit the Schodack residents. She then turned the presentation over to Ms. Tacke who presented a detailed report on library usage for 2015. She highlighted some key benefits to Schodack residents, including free/reduced museum passes, summer reading programs, partnership with Schodack Island State Park for story walks and movie nights, and monthly book mobile for seniors. Future services would include a book mobile to Schodack Senior Center allowing seniors access to the library and installing fiber optic cables to increase internet speed. Ms. Dugas Hughes also highlighted the library services utilized by Schodack residents such as small business services, public computers, and wireless internet. She acknowledged that the three libraries (Nassau, East Greenbush, and Castleton) are aware of financial restraints and are looking for a modest budget increase for 2017 for the Castleton Public Library only. East Greenbush and Nassau are seeking the same budgeted amount as the previous year. The budgets for 2017, as outlined in the Town of Schodack Library Usage Report 2015, include \$108,000.00 (\$2,000.00 increase) for Castleton, \$272,415.00 for East Greenbush, and \$25,000.00 for Nassau.

S. Dowds pointed out that the three libraries seem to be working together. He also mentioned that they seem to be increasing their service and resources to the Schodack community.

The board introduced Mrs. Reed as the Building Department Secretary and asked her to say a few words. She explained that she has been a resident of Schodack for the past 28 years with her husband Frank and two sons. She said she is greatful for the opportunity and looks forward to working for the town.

Review of Resolutions

In regards to resolution [2016-190], S. Dowds mentioned that Chief Peter accidentally omitted the shipping costs for the Tasers which would total \$61.25. Resolution [2016-195] is designed to create awareness to people who are on the Autism spectrum. This originated in Dutchess County and is circulating throughout the state. For resolution [2016-197], S. Dowds suggested that the date be changed because it falls on Columbus Day weekend. B. Goodell said it was usually the end of September but the agency was already booked for that date, so it was rescheduled for October 8th. After a brief discussion it was agreed upon that the date would be stricken and replaced with a date to be negotiated. S. Dowds explained that for resolution [2016-198], the town had been in negotiations with Dr. Drumm for several years to purchase his property but could not reach an agreement. Dr. Drumm demolished the house on the property and has chosen to gift the land to the town. S. Dowds asked to amend the resolution to include that a title search and survey be conducted as well as the Town would pay the current school taxes before the

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land was removed from the tax roll. C. Bult inquired if a survey of the land had been done for the easement to build the water tower. S. Dowds stated that it was possible and if so then the survey wouldn't be needed. At a future meeting the board will invite Dr. Drumm to come and ceremoniously sign over the deed. S. Dowds explained that resolution [2016-199] will turn over easements for water lines for phase 1 of the Spinney. The sewer agreement with Schodack Central School District, due to the unexpected passing of Superintendent Horan, was delayed. Resolution [2016-201] would allow the contract to be submitted and designs to be created which are needed for the approval process. C. Swartz inquired that if the design is not approve, is the District still responsible to pay? S. Dowds said yes.

Board Discussion/Agenda

After reviewing the resolutions, the Supervisor opened the meeting to comments from the board. In regards to resolution [2016-199], C. Bult asked if we were in possession of the as-builts for the project. S. Dowds said we would have them after the end of phase 2. C. Kenney asked if A. Gruenberg created a policy to bring to the board for the purchase of Tasers [2016-190]. S. Dowds said A. Gruenberg has approved the policy and suggested that the Chief Peter speak to the NYMIR attorney to make sure he was okay with the Taser policy as well. C. Bult wanted assurance that NYMIR and as well as fellow Board members felt the policy was acceptable. C. Bult inquired if resolution [2016-200] involved asking Mr. Curtis to maintain the Town owned cemeteries. S. Dowds assured him that he is only setting corner markers and marking out graves. C. Swartz continued that he would like to thank Mr. Curtis for volunteering his time. The board agreed.

Departmental Reports: The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Assessor, Town Clerk, Building Department, and Police.

Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments: The Board reviewed claims #16-1152 to #16-1324 on Abstract No. 2016-08 in the amount of \$288,090.88, including the claims paid prior (\$192,580.01).

Public Comment

B. Hotaling asked the board about possibly selling his current trailer to Goold Orchards or another buyer to recoup some of the cost. S. Dowds advised him that the boards concern was with the proper disposal of the trailer and selling it would be fine.

Resolution [2016-190]: M. Sherwood asked if the police officers currently have cameras and/or mics on their person. S. Dowds stated that they do not as of yet but they are looking into body and dashboard cameras. M. Sherwood suggested that they may want to look into that before the Tasers are issued. R. Lemka inquired on how many Tasers were being purchased. C. Kenney stated there would be 3 purchased.

Resolution [2016-193]: R. Lemka stated that the day camp costs are more than \$3,000. S. Dowds answered that the agreement was for money from Rensselaer County.

Resolution [2016-196]: M. Sherwood asked if the Schodack Central School District will pay the expenses as explained in resolution. S. Dowds said yes. R. Lemka asked if the project would start on Maple Hill Road. S. Dowds stated that it would start by Castle Ridge. He continued that the State Education Department (SED) has put pressure on School districts to get off septic systems and join public sewer systems. R. Lemka followed by

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asking if there is a contract with the engineer. S. Dowds said that there is no current description of what the engineer will do. He assured him that the contract with the school district includes the engineer work. R. Lemka inquired if there would be another resolution in the future for additional costs? S. Dowds stated that he didn't know at this time. Since the school district is paying, we will need to keep them apprised of the progress.

Resolution [2016-198]: M. Sherwood asked if there were any current plans for the property once Dr. Drumm gifts it to the Town. S. Dowds stated that there are none as of yet. M. Sherwood also questioned what will happen once the property is off the tax rolls. S. Dowds explained that we do not currently own the access road to the water tower however by having road frontage on 9 & 20; we would own access to the tower. He also mentioned that the property could be used to extend the parking lot. There are many possibilities with the 18 acres. R. Lemka inquired if Dr. Drumm's house had been torn down on the property. S. Dowds said yes, approximately 6 weeks ago. R. Lemka made a suggestion to have local boy scouts come in to clear trails for a possible park annex. F. Curtis commended Dr. Drumm for the donation and recommended that a plaque or sign be erected in his honor as a past Supervisor of the Town. He also reminded the board of the deadline on October 10th for fall grievance.

Resolution [2016-199]: R. Lemka asked who was responsible for the water main break on Miller Rd. S. Dowds explained that it was an accident that occurred while tapping into the current line. He continued that according to the DOT Regional Director the line split due to its age. The section, which was plastic, was in the process of being replaced with ductile iron.

Resolution [2016-200]: R. Lemka asked if F. Curtis would be maintaining/mowing all Town-Owned Cemeteries. S. Dowds stated that F. Curtis would be setting up markers at Clarks Chapel Cemetery and others, along with marking out plots for burials. F. Curtis explained that he had been approaching the town for over 2 years to take over for the cemeteries that still had open burial plots. He continued that Clarks Chapel has a total of 5 open plots with 4 graves each equaling 20 possible burials. Given his current position as President of Woodlawn Cemetery, he has the experience on laying out burials. He also mentioned that during the discussion process many names were brought up but Caretaker was decided as the most generic.

Resolution [2016-202]: R. Lemka asked if the Town has to pay for the material to be taken away. He stated that East Greenbush grinds up their brush into mulch and offers it to their residents. B. Goodall mentioned that we also offer mulch to our residents.
