Supervisor Dowds called the October 13, 2016 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

#### Departmental Reports

The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Town Clerk, Building Department, Planning & Zoning and Human Resources.

The Supervisor reported that the Board received a Thank You note from the Castleton Cemetery Association for the donation made towards the historical marker (see September 8, 2016 minutes). With regard to the Police Department, he noted that they have responded to three overdoses within the past 10 days that required the use of NARCAN, which demonstrates that our town is not immune to the drug problem. The police are diligently working on these issues, but it is a big battle. C. Bult added that he was at one of the calls and commended Officer Roy for his professionalism in administering the NARCAN as well as the time he took with the family after, explaining what they should do moving forward.

### Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments

The Board reviewed claims #16-1455 to #16-1648 on Abstract No. 2016-10.

### Briefing of the Resolution Agenda Discussion-Resolutions

S. Dowds briefed the Resolution Agenda. With regard to Resolution [2016-217], the Supervisor explained that the labor attorney will be involved with: the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) that becomes effective Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>, the Employee Handbook, personnel and health benefit issues. Resolution [2016-218] relates to the IPS training that was held on-site for the building and planning & zoning personnel. The cost of the half-day class was \$588.30,

which included \$28.30 for travel. Resolutions [2016-225] – [2016-231] authorize the public hearings for the water rates and capital charges for the districts listed. Similarly, resolutions [2016-232] – [2016-238] are for the sewer districts. Resolution [2016-239] authorizes the public hearing notice for the 2017 Preliminary Budget. Resolution [2016-240] is done annually to update the equivalent dwelling units (EDU) for most water districts (*this relates to the capital rolls and charges*). The Supervisor noted that the only change from last year is the addition of a new property code (682) for recreational facilities which will be used for the Spinney Clubhouse. Resolution [2016-242] will be discussed in more detail later in the meeting. With regard to resolution [2016-243], the Supervisor explained that it was left blank until the Board has further discussion, which will take place in Executive Session as it relates to a contractual (union) matter. All other resolutions are self-explanatory.

## **Executive Session**

C. Bult made a motion to enter into Executive Session at 7:12 p.m., to discuss contractual matters relating to the selection of the health insurance plan. Seconded by C. Swartz

C. Kenney made a motion to adjourn the Executive Session at 7:27 p.m., seconded by C. Bult.

### Board Discussion/Agenda/Other Matters of Business

Based on the Executive Session discussion, the Supervisor stated that the Board will put forth the following insurance plan for consideration, CDPHP-EPO Plan 120, which will be effective 12/01/2016 (Resolution [2016-243]). The rest of the proposed resolution will be stricken. He explained that the CDPHP plan offered to employees last year is no longer available to the Town because the State Legislature changed the definition of a "large group" plan from 50 employees to 100 employees. It is now before the State Legislature to roll that back, as has been done by most other states, but that has not yet occurred, therefore the Board had to look at other plans for 2017. If that changes, the Board can review the plans that would be made available to them at that time. He stated that the plan selected is closest to the current plan. C. Kenney added that the Town will still offer NYSHIP. The Supervisor noted that the NYSHIP plan is effective from January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, and the Board is looking at a 13-month plan for CDPHP so all the plans will have the same effective date.

With regard to resolution [2016-242], Guideline 3 (first two bullets) C. Bult said he and C. Kenney spoke with the Highway Superintendent, regarding the current \$500.00 limit. The mechanics were spending a significant amount of time soliciting quotes for vehicle parts and getting timely responses. They felt that allowing them to spend \$1,000.00 without having to get multiple quotes, will be more cost efficient in the long-term. Therefore, based on that discussion, he felt the resolution should be amended to decrease the cap from \$1500.00 to \$1,000.00. C. Rex felt that employees should still seek the most-cost effective solution, even though it is not required. S. Dowds felt the Town was fortunate, because the employees who do the ordering are very cost-conscientious and he felt they will continue to seek out the best price.

C. Rex asked the status of the Employee Handbook. S. Dowds said he would like the labor attorney (resolution [2016-217]) to look at the outstanding questions and meet with the Board so it can be finalized. C. Bult said he would prefer to have the Board review and respond to the questions. Then if they had any additional questions, they could seek the attorney's advice. Other Board members agreed. C. Kenney said in the past, the Board had approved similar resolutions, but received very little information about how the issues were being resolved, so, personally, he felt the amount should be lowered to \$2,500.00. However, if the Supervisor reaches out to the rest of the Board and keeps them informed, he was okay with spending the money. Atty. Gruenberg said he thinks that Atty. Goldberger will be reviewing the health insurance as it relates to the union contracts, the handbook and other personnel issues that have been under discussion over the last 3 – 4 meetings. C. Bult said given all the issues the \$5,000.00 could be guickly achieved and suggested that they channel the majority of his focus on the personnel issues and labor rather than the handbook. S. Dowds agreed. With regard to personnel, he said that FLSA is coming quickly and all resource materials advise you to consulate with an attorney for compliance. Additionally, our Human Resources person could use his expertise on legal questions, health benefits and the union contracts next year. C. Kenney agreed to fund the resolution as written, but asked the Supervisor to make a better effort to keep the Board informed regarding the status of the issues. Additionally, he suggested that one board member should attend some of the discussions. The Supervisor said that would be dependent on the issue; if it is a personnel issue, they can't be involved.

C. Swartz asked if the Board could reach out to the State to ask them to do a safety and speed evaluation on Rte. 9 in the area by Pilot. He also thought a more visible police presence could be helpful. C. Rex agreed. C. Bult suggested we adopt a resolution to ask the State to do another speed/traffic safety study.

### Public Comment

**Resolution [2016-205]:** K. Stokem invited the Board to attend the Renewable Energy Fair which will be held on October 29<sup>th</sup> at the Maple Hill High School. Additionally, he read information regarding a congressional review of FERC and said he was going to forward it to the Board for their review and possible support. With regard to the Purchasing Guidelines, Guideline 6 (certain exemptions) he asked why there was an exception for professional services. S. Dowds said that is allowed by State law. Mr. Stokem said that some of the highest costs the town pays are engineering fees and felt it would be a good idea to get quotes. Atty. Gruenberg said normally, the Board circulates a Request for Proposals (RFP).

A person commented on the two programs the Transfer Station is running this month – the Fall Clean-up, which offers free or reduced prices and the Hazardous Waste Disposal which is free. He felt the men at the transfer station do an excellent job and he was happy to see that he was getting something for his tax dollars. The Supervisor said it was always nice to hear good things about town employees and relayed a recent incident involving a Transfer Station employee and return of a wallet that was accidently dropped. The resident stopped by to tell the Supervisor he was grateful that the town has such honest employees.

R. Lemka asked about the training class for planning, zoning and building personnel to which the Supervisor responded. Mr. Lemka questioned Guideline 1 which allows all town officers, department heads, etc. to purchase goods. The Supervisor said that was always in the purchasing policy. It is not new. He explained that documentation must always be attached to every voucher and all vouchers get reviewed by the Comptroller's Office before they are authorized for payment. The reason they were revamping the purchasing practices was to make it more consistent to what is allowed by law. Based on the earlier discussion, the Board decided to amend the guidelines to lower the amount from \$1500.00 to \$1000.00 in Guidelines 3 and 6. Mr. Lemka asked why they struck the language regarding the cost of the insurance. The Supervisor said that related to what the employee pays and it varies depending on the job description, when they were hired, etc. Mr. Lemka asked if retirees and widows are covered, and if so, do they pay for some of the costs. The Supervisor said they are and most do. Mr. Lemka took exception to the having the insurance discussed in Executive Session. Atty. Gruenberg said it was necessary because of the impacts on the union contracts.

C. Bult asked how much lead time is needed to notice another budget meeting if they determine one is needed. The Town Clerk said there is not a set time frame; it is as soon as possible when known.

## TOWN OF SCHODACK PROCUREMENT POLICY

## **GUIDELINE #1**

Every prospective purchase of goods or services shall be evaluated to determine the applicability of General Municipal Law, §103. Every Town Officer, Board Member, Department Head or other personnel with the requisite purchasing authority (hereinafter "Purchaser") shall estimate the cumulative amount of the items of supply or equipment needed in a given year. That estimate shall include the canvass of other Town departments and past history to determine the likely annual value of the commodity to be acquired. Upon request, the Comptroller can calculate the cumulative amount of a particular commodity needed by all Town departments based on past history. The information gathered and conclusions reached shall be documented and kept with the file or other documentation supporting the purchase activity.

## **GUIDELINE #2**

 All purchases of a) supplies or equipment which exceed \$20,000 in the fiscal year or b) public works contracts which exceed \$35,000 shall be formally bid pursuant to GML, \$103.

## GUIDELINE #3

• ALL purchases of:

- Less than **\$1,500 <u>\$1,000</u>** is left to the discretion of the Purchaser, but written/fax/email quotes are preferred.
- Less than \$10,000 but greater or equal to \$1,500 \$1,000 requires a written request for the goods and written/fax/email quotes from two vendors.
- Less than \$20,000 but greater or equal to \$10,000 requires a written request for proposal (RFP) and written/fax/email quotes from three vendors.

## • All Estimated Public Works Contracts of:

- Less than **\$5,000** is left to the discretion of the Purchaser, but written/fax/email quotes are preferred.
- Less than \$15,000 but greater or equal to \$5,000 requires a written request for proposal (RFP) and written/fax/email quotes from two contractors.
- Less than \$35,000 but greater or equal to \$15,000 requires a written request for proposal (RFP) and written/fax/email quotes from three contractors.

Any written RFP shall describe the desired goods, quantity, and particulars of delivery. The purchaser shall compile a list of all vendors/contractors from whom written/fax/email/oral quotes have been requested and the quotes offered. All information gathered in complying with the procedure of this guideline shall be filed with the documentation supporting the subsequent purchase or public works contract. All public works contracts must be in the manner approved by the Town Attorney.

## **GUIDELINE #4**

- The lowest responsible proposal or quote shall be awarded the purchase or public works contract unless the purchaser prepares a written justification providing adequate reasons why it is in the best interest of the town and its taxpayers to make an award to other than the lowest bidder. If a bidder is not deemed responsible, facts supporting that judgement shall also be documented and filed with the record supporting the procurement or public works contract.
- Pursuant to GML §103, State Finance Law §163, the Town of Schodack may award purchase contracts which would otherwise be subject to the "lowest bidder" rule on the basis of best value to a responsive and responsible bidder or offeror. Factors that may be used to enact the "best value" option, where cost efficiency over time to award the good(s) or service(s) to other than the lowest bidder, are:
  - a) Lowest cost of maintenance for good(s), service(s), or professional service(s);
  - b) Durability of good(s), service(s) or professional services;

- c) Higher quality of good(s), service(s), or professional services; or
- d) Longer product life of good(s), service(s) or professional service.

## GUIDELINE #5

• A good faith effort shall be made to obtain the required number of proposals or quotations. If the purchaser is unable to obtain the required number of proposals or quotations, the purchaser shall document the attempt made at obtaining the proposals or quotations. In no event shall the inability to obtain the proposals or quotations be a bar to the procurement.

## GUIDELINE #6

- Except when directed by the Town Board, no solicitation of written proposals or quotations shall be required under the following circumstances:
  - Acquisition of professional services or services requiring special or technical skill, training, or expertise.
  - Emergency purchases pursuant to GML §103, where goods or services must be purchased immediately and a delay in order to seek alternate proposals may threaten public buildings, public property, or the life, health, safety, or welfare of the residents.
  - Sole source situations
  - Goods purchased under a Federal, State or County contract.
  - Goods purchased from agencies for the blind or severely handicapped.
  - Goods purchased from other governmental agencies including correctional facilities.
  - Goods purchased at auction
  - Goods purchased for less than \$1,500.00 \$1,000.00.
  - Public Works contracts for less than \$5,000.00.

## GUIDELINE #7

• Pursuant to §103 (16) of the New York State General Municipal Law, the Town Board authorizes the purchase of apparatus, materials, equipment and supplies, and to contract for services related to the installation, maintenance or repair of those items, through the use of contracts let by the United States or any agency thereof, any state or any other political subdivision or district therein. The Contract must be made available for use by other governmental entities.
