Supervisor Dowds called the March 9, 2017 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:08 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

The Supervisor asked the Board to digress from the agenda to discuss resolution [2017-116]. He called upon Chief Belardo to explain why the police department wants a utility vehicle rather than a sedan and if the utility vehicle was much more costly than the sedan. Chief Belardo stated that the difference in price is approximately \$2,000.00, which is relatively small when comparing these two models. They prefer the utility vehicle because: the inside of it is much roomier, has more head room, better clearance during winter weather, and because it is larger they are able to carry all necessary equipment. It is a more versatile vehicle. They currently have three different types of vehicles and are trying to standardize the fleet, having the Explorer (utility vehicle) as the base car. It is not a full-size SUV, and as stated before has more personal and cargo room than a sedan.

Pinning Ceremony-Chief of Police

Lt. Jon Reickert officiated at the pinning ceremony for newly appointed Chief Belardo. He gave a brief history of Chief Belardo's personal, academic and professional background. He noted that Chief Belardo was born and raised in Schodack and his father was a former Schodack Chief of Police. Mr. Belardo (father), accompanied by Chief Belardo's wife, was given the honor of pinning the stars on his son. Following the pinning, Chief Belardo was given a round of congratulatory applause. Chief Belardo thanked the residents, his family and fellow officers for their attendance at this auspicious occasion. He thanked the Board for their confidence in his abilities and giving him the opportunity to lead the police force. He said it was an honor to follow in the foot-steps of his father and his predecessor, Chief Peter. After the Town Clerk administered the Oath of Office, the Supervisor called upon former Chief of Police Bernhardt Peter to address the audience. Chief Peter, who traveled from Florida, said he had worked with Chief Belardo for 15 years and didn't think the Town could have selected anyone better. He knows the community, knows the job and has the

respect and admiration of his peers. On behalf of the Board, S. Dowds said the Board is delighted to have Joe Belardo succeed Bernhardt Peter as the Chief of Police for Schodack.

Briefing of the Resolution Agenda

With regard to resolution [2017-108], the Supervisor explained that Lynne Torello will be the Acting Dog Control Officer at the rate of \$50.00/call only in the instances when Mr. Martell is sick or on vacation. With regard to resolution [2017-113], the Supervisor explained that the Board accepted the lowest bid of \$239,919.00 from Northeast Petroleum Technologies, Inc. for the Fueling Facility project at the highway garage. Resolution [2017-115] relates to the convoluted mechanism municipalities have to use regarding Time Warner's (Spectrum) payment of taxes. He explained that this is done annually. The simplest way to accomplish this would be for the Town to deduct the taxes from the franchise fee, but we are not allowed by law to do that. We have to levy the tax and then send the county a check for the taxes, who then sends it to Time Warner. With regard to resolution [2017-118], the Supervisor explained that the Town provides emergency water to the Village of Castleton via an interconnection behind Maplecrest. Pursuant to our contract with them, the rate changes annually based upon January's consumer price index (CPI). In 2013 the rate was \$4.00/1,000 gallons and this will set it at \$4.11/1,000 gallons. Resolution [2017-120] will be withdrawn because we only have three Board members present and C. Kenney would have abstained from voting as it relates to him.

Public Comment

M. Sherwood asked why the contract with Shulman, Howard & McPherson (resolution [2017-119]) was increasing. S. Dowds explained that they initially thought that the attorney advising the Zoning Update Committee would only attend selected meetings. However, they found as the process evolved, that his expertise and knowledge was needed at all of the meetings. Ms. Sherwood asked if there has been any movement on the sale of the former Town Hall property. The Supervisor said he has spoken with two real estate companies and the money isn't really there. He hopes that as development in that area takes place (i.e. – the Questar building), the property will become more valuable and the offers will increase in price. Ms. Sherwood asked the status of the service area between Exits 11 – 12 on I-90 and if NYSDOT was going to reconfigure Exit 12 at the Rt. 9 intersection. The Supervisor explained that the service area began quickly but when other agencies became involved, it came to a halt. It is his understanding that they may possibly continue with the project sometime this year. He believed that the Exit 12 intersection was in the planning stages, but he didn't really know the status of the project.

K. Stokem invited the Board and the audience to a presentation sponsored by the Rensselaer Plateau Alliance regarding climate changes in the Hudson Valley. S. Dowds responded that they all received emails from him and others regarding this same topic so the Board is well aware of the meeting. He asked him to be brief as it was sponsored by a private organization. Mr. Stokem took exception to the Supervisor's comments and continued that with some of the impacts of climate change. It was his opinion that the Board would be remiss if they didn't attend this presentation to learn how climate changes might impact Schodack.

Sera Hoavanecz, Public Health Technician, addressed the Board and audience regarding radon detection in residential homes. She explained that the County received a grant and they are doing public outreach about radon and giving out free test kits. Radon is

the number cause of lung cancer in non-smoking adults and there are approximately 20,000 deaths annually. She said radon is an odorless, invisible, heavier gas and is more prevalent in the basement and first floor. The higher up you go in a home, will have lower radon levels. She said it didn't really matter what type of basement you have, it is in the soil under the floor. She said Rensselaer County is a geographic area that has higher levels of radon. After they place the free device, they will collect it within the required time, and the homeowner will be notified of the results. She reiterated that this was all done at no cost to the homeowner. She said the free results you get can be used on real estate transactions since many funding institutes now require a radon test. She cautioned that if the results indicate that there are high levels of Radon, unfortunately, there is no financial assistance to help mitigate it. She believed that mitigation estimates range between \$800 - \$1800.00. S. Dowds said that he had radon in a former home in Schodack. It cost him approximately \$2,000.00 and he briefly explained the procedure used.

Regarding the Acting Dog Control Officer appointment, R. Lemka felt that if the DCO (Paul Martel) was on vacation and the Town had to call Ms. Torello, the \$50.00 charge for her services should be deducted from Mr. Martell's salary. Although Mr. Lemka liked the idea that each person using the fueling station would have a code, he felt its cost was extremely high and wondered what they were doing that warranted that kind of expense. Mr. Lemka commented on the Battisti water situation. He hoped the Board would look at all options to help the residents in that area. S. Dowds said they have had preliminary board discussions and unfortunately, all of them appear to be quite costly.
