Supervisor Harris called the December 13, 2018 Town Board Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

Executive Session

C. Bult made a motion at 6:00 p.m. to enter into executive session for the purpose of conducting interviews for the Assistant to the Assessor position. Seconded by C. Kenney. The candidates being interviewed for the position of Assistant to the Assessor were: Michelle Slovak, Coleen Papas, and Ann St. Peter.

4 Ayes 0 Noes. **MOTION CARRIED.** Ayes - J. Bult, M. Kenney, T. Rex, D. Harris. Noes - 0. C. Swartz recused himself from all interviews due to a conflict of interest.

C. Bult made a motion at 7:01 p.m. to adjourn the executive session. Seconded by C. Kenney.

- S. Harris recognized Genevieve Bombard of Maple Hill who was conducting an internship with the Town. He noted she had been visiting all departments to gain an understanding of how local government operates.
- S. Harris informed the board that the fire districts that were involved in the consolidation study, had requested an extension until January regarding their decision. He said there would be no additional cost to extension the contract.

Briefing of the Resolution Agenda Discussion-Resolutions

The Supervisor gave a brief review of the resolutions. With regard to resolution 2018-315, S. Harris noted Mr. Finkle, who was a past President of the Castleton Fire Company, had passed away last month in Florida. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

Board Comment

C. Bult recommended, as the board did not have adequate time to review the changes to the fee schedules, that resolutions 2018-320 to 2018-322 be withdrawn. C. Swartz agreed. S. Harris called for a motion, which was made by C. Rex and seconded by C. Swartz, to withdraw the afore mentioned resolutions. All members agreed.

Public Comment

Resolution 2018-300: K. Stokem asked for clarification regarding this resolution. S. Harris said an increase was needed for the professional services offer by Tabner, Ryan and Keniry, LLC. C. Bult added the firm represented the town for any water and sewer needs.

Resolution 2018-301: K. Stokem asked if Aetna was being offered to employees as their healthcare provider. S. Harris said only for the retirees and noted the change would be a considerable savings to the town. Mr. Stokem asked if there would be added benefits offered. C. Kenney said Aetna was portable and retirees would be able to utilize it throughout the country.

Resolution 2018-302: K. Stokem asked if the amount to represent the Planning Board would continue to grow. S. Harris said he did not know. Atty. Mullahy said all papers had been filed and they were awaiting the Judge's decision. He explained the original budget set forth had been exceeded by the law firm and this represented costs to date. Any additional funds that may be needed will be voted upon by the board if they arise. Mr. Stokem asked if the town would receive any reimbursement from Amazon for the legal fees. Atty. Mullahy said he was not aware of any arrangement that had been made.

Resolution 2018-307: K. Stokem asked if this was an annual renewal for the insurance policy. The Town Clerk said yes and added that there was only a one percent increase from last year. The cost would be distributed between the A, B, and DB funds.

Resolution 2018-308: K. Stokem asked if employees could choose between the policies for their health insurance coverage. S. Harris said yes.

Resolution 2018-309: K. Stokem asked if this was a new machine for the Town Clerk's Office. The Town Clerk said yes. The current printer was having an issue with black marks which were not allowing the staff to print legal documents such as death certificates or marriage transcripts. She had researched replacement of the defective transfer unit; however, the \$400.00 cost was not feasible for a six year old machine.

Resolution 2018-310: K. Stokem asked for clarification regarding the Hazard Mitigation

Plan. S. Harris said the plan, which was presented by Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), would be county wide to ensure that all municipalities were prepared in the event of an emergency. K. Holmes and N. Fuda would be authorized to represent the town in the event it was needed. C. Bult added that the county would be administering the plan. N. Fuda said it would identify potential hazards and allows the town to apply for grant funding; however, it would not interfere with the Town receiving emergency funding from the FEMA.

Resolutions 2018-313 and 2018-314: K. Stokem asked why the projects were being closed. S. Harris said they had been completed.

Resolutions 2018-316 to 2018-319: K. Stokem asked if the \$180,000.00 for engineering had been budgeted for 2018. C. Bult said resolution 2018-317 was in the budget; however, the remaining resolutions were new. S. Harris said the town wished to analyze the potential for Sewer District 1, Ext. 1 to extend to Route 9 [2018-318]. This would open the potential for development along Route 9. K. Stokem asked what the \$85,000.00 would cover. C. Kenney said it would cover the map plan and report which would show the cost of the extension. K. Stokem asked if the effluent would be pumped from Route 9 or would it be gravity fed. S. Harris said, without the study, that was unknown. K. Stokem said he was under the impression that the line for Schodack Central School District was not designed for development. In the event the report showed the potential, he asked the board to put the needs of the residents on Maple Hill Road before potential development and offer for them to connect in. S. Harris said they needed to have a starting point before they could branch out.

- J. Colongione of Middlesex Road presented a formal letter and read a statement asking board members to amendment the current zoning code to remove "nursing homes and senior citizen housing" from being constructed in R-20 zones. The letter was duly filed in the office of the Town Clerk. T. Reamon of Oakwood Street and D. Calamaras of Birchwood Drive voiced their support for the zoning amendment as well. Mr. Reamon submitted a letter that was also duly filed with the town clerk.
- R. Allen of New Road addressed the board regarding an incident he encountered with a logger who received a permit from the town. He stated the logger trespassed on his property and removed a large oak tree. He said the police had been contacted who said nothing could be done as it was a civil matter. A small claim judgement had been made in his favor; however, he wished to notify the town of what the logger had done. S. Harris said this matter should be presented to the planning board who would meet on December 17th. He thanked Mr. Allen for coming in and asked for a copy of the judgement to be given to the town clerk.
- K. Travers-Main of Maple Hill Road invited the board to attend a technology conference on January 5th regarding the clean-up of the Dewey Loeffel landfill. She noted a portion of Nassau Lake, which was affected by the landfill, was located in Schodack and asked the board members to come and show their support.
