Supervisor Harris called the February 28, 2019 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. C. Kenney and C. Swartz were absent.

S. Harris asked all who were present to remain standing for a moment of silence for Paul Puccio who had passed away a few days prior. He noted Mr. Puccio was a member of the Schodack Planning Board as well as a past member of the Questar III BOCES Board and Schodack Central School Board. He read resolution 2019-109 which outlined Mr. Puccio's accomplishments. A copy of said resolution will be given to the family.

Agenda Item

Cemetery Marker: Norman Wiley, President of the Castleton Cemetery Association, asked the board to consider providing financial assistance for the purchase of a historical marker for the Horizon View Cemetery. He explained the cemetery had been in existence for fifty plus years, being established in 1965 with the first burial occurring in 1975. The cost of the marker was approximately \$1,200.00 with the association asking the board to cover fifty percent or \$600.00. He noted the board had assisted financially with the marker for the Mountain View Cemetery marker approximately four years ago and added that under General Municipal Law §165-A, the town may make a financial contribution to the cemetery. A copy of the section of law was given to all board members present. S. Harris recommended a resolution be placed on the next meeting agenda and said he felt it was a good idea to support the cemetery. C. Rex said she agreed as well. C. Bult asked where the sign would be located. Mr. Wiley said on the side closest to Goold's Orchards.

Public Hearing Proposed Local Law 1-2019: Alternative Veteran Exemption

S. Harris called the public hearing for proposed local law 1-2019 to order at 7:11 p.m.

The Town Clerk summarized the Affidavit of Publication seeking public comment on proposed Local Law No. 1 of 2019 (P1-2019) to amend the Alternative Veteran Exemption Law for the Town of Schodack Chapter 197, Article III, Section 12.1. The legal notice was published in the February 21, 2019 edition of *The Record* and posted on the Town Clerk's signboard and the Town's website on February 22, 2019.

S. Harris asked if there was any board comment regarding the public hearing. Hearing none, he asked for any public comment. Also receiving no public comment, S. Harris closed the hearing at 7:12 p.m.

WHEREAS, at the time of Paul's death he was serving as a Planning Board member to the Town of Schodack with 13 years credited to his 2nd 7 year term serving on several sub-committees and advisory boards, and to his credit he worked diligently to provide the Town with a single document for the Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, Paul brought to his post a unique perspective as a great conversationalist, friend and neighbor, reviewing each project before the Planning Board with his insight and expertise, and

WHEREAS, Paul sought to advance planning initiatives within the Planning Board review process by offering his insight, wisdom, and guidance, working to ensure and promote sustainable development of our town while preserving the things about it we all hold dear and always challenged applicants to be a "good neighbor"
