Supervisor Dowds called the September 24, 2015 meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

Briefing of Resolution Agenda

The Supervisor noted that resolution [2015-192] will be withdrawn. He explained that the Berkshire Regional Planning Commission (BRPC) was currently working with the BCK law firm to determine if the agreement was actually needed. With respect to [2015-193], he is adding Item (10), the 2002 Jeep Liberty, which had been previously discussed by the Board. C. Curtis said it was his understanding that the vehicle was still being used by the Assessing Department. S. Dowds said yes, but they only use the car about once a month so he spoke with the Building Inspector who indicated that he is willing to let them use his car on those days. It will just require a little more scheduling. Determination: The consensus of the Board was in agreement and the resolution will be amended to add Item (10) 2002 Jeep Liberty. Also resolution [2015-194] will be withdrawn because the audit is scheduled to be done October 5 – October 6, 2015. C. Curtis asked if the water and sewer districts budgets will be done in November. S. Dowds said yes. C. Bult asked the Comptroller if the charge for Fairpoint Communications for service at the Town Garage was a normal charge. If so, perhaps, they should look into service through Time Warner Business Class since they use that as their internet service provider, which might be less expensive. S. Dowds felt that was a good point and they will look into his suggestion. The Town Clerk requested that additional language be added to resolution [2015-196] regarding the opening date and time of the bids received. **Determination:** It was the consensus of the Board to add the following sentence to resolution [2015-196], "Bids received will be opened at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 13, 2015 at the Schodack Town Hall, 265 <u>Schuurman Rd., Castleton, NY.</u> All other resolutions are self-explanatory.

Public Comment

- B. Spink, presented a letter to the Board, dated 9/24/15, regarding her disapproval and dissatisfaction with the Supervisor's position on withholding the identity of the owners of the Project Red proposal. She felt it was deceitful and just an attempt to get warehousing all along Route 9 by keeping Birchwood neighbors in the dark. It was her opinion that the intent of the PD-3 zone was to encourage development in the Route 9 corridor that was compatible with residential housing. She felt that Project Red is a "warehouse" which is not allowed in PD-3, rather than a "sales distribution center" which is. She hoped that the Board would do the right thing when voting on Project Red.
- K. Stokem asked for an update regarding the Kinder Morgan pipeline. The Supervisor stated that the B.C.K. Law firm (Berkshire Group) is representing the County of Rensselaer, towns of Schodack, Nassau, Stephentown and the counties, towns and fire districts in MA. Initially, Rensselaer County paid for the representation of area towns. The Berkshire Group will be meeting again later this month. Thus far:
 - It is anticipated that Kinder Morgan still intends to file the official application by the end of October 2015. It takes about 1 year from submission of the application to get approval from FERC. Once they file, BCK will apply for Intervener status on the town's behalf.
 - 2) Kinder Morgan is still looking at all three routes- the northern, the southern and the Berkshire Spur. They may not know which route is selected until the end of the process (after they file the application). FERC directed Kinder Morgan to do an analysis on all three routes and if none of those routes work they have to come up with another alternative.
 - 3) The comment period for the scoping session will be extended until October 16th.
- Mr. Stokem asked if the Town was doing anything else to try and stop the pipeline, apart from being part of the Berkshire Group. S. Dowds stated that the documentation being submitted is town and area specific as well as those done comprehensively. Mr. Stokem said those opposing the pipeline have been trying to focus on Bethlehem-Delmar area and the county of Albany, as a whole, to get them more involved and would appreciate any support that the Town Board could offer to help achieve that goal.
- J. Jensis expressed concern that if the project is approved, Kinder Morgan's equipment could damage town roads and wondered if the town had taken any steps to protect them. S. Dowds said it was too premature to do that at this point. Mr. Jensis also raised the issue of a proposed access road at the end of Jensis Rd., wondering if the Town could make them construct it according to town specifications. S. Dowds didn't think so, but again, it was too premature to address that at this time. He explained that the municipalities are joining together for two reasons: (1) to oppose the pipeline path and (2) if they are not successful, to get some protections for the entities, which might give them some leverage regarding those issues raised.
- J. Jensis asked the Supervisor to have the police monitor the tractor-trailer traffic on Rte. 9 near Pilot. He said when he drives in that area, the trucks often create hazardous conditions and they should be ticketed.

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R. Lemka felt it was unfair to the taxpayers to have to pay the \$10.00 registration fee to bid on the equipment to be auctioned. S. Dowds explained it was a requirement of the on-line auction company. Mr. Lemka voiced concern about the type of soil under the proposed new Stewart's store. He believed it was bare shale and if a gasoline spill occurred, it could jeopardize the water of any surrounding wells. He thought Stewart's should be willing to pay the cost of running water to the neighbor, if that ever occurred.

With regard to Project Red, Mr. Lemka said he knew the councilmen were opposed to the secrecy surrounding it, but people did not know if the board was in favor of the project. He thought it was a good company, but a bad location and would be better suited for small businesses. He felt that warehouses/sales distribution centers should be located on Rte. 9 where there are other similar type businesses. With regard to the approval of the project, he suggested that the Town Board should have lobbied the Planning Board since they appoint those members and they (Town Board) should be the ones "making the dog's tail wag" not the other way around. Mr. Stokem felt the limited public comment period at the recent Planning Board meeting was unfair to the public. The Supervisor stated that the project already had a public hearing and unless it is a public hearing, the Planning Board has traditionally limited the ability for people to talk about a particular project to 15 minutes. Also there were many other issues on their agenda that night, not just that project. Mr. Stokem said while they did extend the comment period to about 20-25 minutes, it was still not enough time for everyone to have their say. S. Dowds explained that they are an independent board and the matter should be raised to them. C. Curtis said some of the town council members agree with the public. He felt the limitation of time for speaking does not seem realistic in today's world. He, too, was not aware that they had a time limit of 15 minutes. With that being the case, then perhaps they should have limited the amount of time a speaker could talk to 3 minutes, so more people had an opportunity to be heard. Perhaps they should reconsider their public comment period and allow for more public input, similar to what is done at Town Board meetings.

Old Business:

Release of Credit/Strawberry Fields: The Supervisor explained that Strawberry Fields is requesting a release of a \$35,000.00 Letter of Credit. Dowds explained that they in the process of filing those papers. C. Bult asked if they will put up another bond for Phase II. The Supervisor said yes.

Battisti Water District: The Supervisor said, with the Board's approval, he will send a response regarding the Battisti water district. C. Bult said he has spoken with some of the residents in that area and gave them an idea of what is going on. Apparently, the residents have some substantial concerns with the privately owned system. S. Dowds said residents have spoken with him as well; however, they need to know if the Town ever decides to take it over, the costs to bring that system into compliance will be significant. In his opinion, they would almost have to rebuild the entire system. C. Bult agreed.
