Supervisor Harris called the December 10, 2020 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

S. Harris said he was pleased to announce, after months of a diminished workforce due to retirements, the Schodack Police Department was welcoming two new officers. He read the following statements highlighting each officer's past employment and contributions to the department:

"Carrie Kane comes to us from the SUNY Albany University Police where she is a 11year veteran. Carrie holds a master's degree in marriage and family therapy with a specialty in relational dynamics. Carrie spent part of her childhood growing up in Schodack and is a current Town resident.

The skills Carrie has amassed over her educational and professional career make her a uniquely qualified addition to our force. Her background in family dynamics and relations make her an excellent addition to our team and will only enhance and build on the close community relations that is a hallmark of our department. Carrie mentioned this very topic as a reason for her desire to come here. Our tight ties with the community with a focus on the individuals we serve and the interactions we have with various civic organizations line up with her goals for her professional career, as well as her desire to serve the town where she lives."

"Ryan (Boehme) has an associate degree from Hudson Valley and comes to us from the Columbia County Sheriff's department. Previous to that, he worked for the Schodack Police Department as a part-time officer.

Ryan's previous experience working for our department makes him an ideal candidate for us. His familiarity with our town and many of his co-workers means he will be able to hit the ground running at a time when the resources of our department have been stretched by the added responsibilities associated with the COVID pandemic. In a conversation Chief Hourigan had with Columbia County Sheriff Barlett, Sheriff Barlett spoke highly of Officer Boehme's professionalism and, while expressing regret he was losing him as deputy, assured Chief Hourigan, we made a good choice. We look forward to Ryan bringing the expanded experience he gained in Columbia County back to Schodack as he returns as a full-time officer."

Following the introduction of each officer, the oath of office was administered by the Town Clerk and a brief pinning ceremony was conducted. S. Harris, on behalf of the town board, congratulated both officers and welcomed them to the Schodack Police Department.

Presentation – Solar Farms

M. Hamor of Solomon Energy (via Zoom) explained that New York State had amended their policy for community solar farms, allowing local municipalities to reap the energy savings.

Under the new terms, the town would have the ability to enter into an agreement to purchase energy from an already constructed solar farm with an annual savings of ten percent or approximately \$3,500.00. He noted there would be no set term limit on the agreement; however, the town would be requested to give three-month notice for termination of the agreement. S. Harris said the board would review the agreement and notify Mr. Hamor of their decision.

Briefing of the Agenda

The Supervisor summarized all remaining resolutions. He noted, with the closing of all KeyBank accounts, the town was requesting a credit card from Pioneer Bank (2020-320). P. Harter added that the company representative had received the application and once it was approved, they would receive the new card. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

Board Comment

Resolution 2020-315: C. Swartz questioned the cost to repair the roof, as he was under the impression that only \$50,000.00 had been budgeted. P. Harter said he was correct but as there was a surplus under appropriation code A3120.4, due to lower employment, the additional cost could be covered using those funds as well as the fund balance. C. Swartz asked why the repair cost was so high. D. Kelly explained that upon inspection of the main and lower roofs, it was determined that some panels on the main roof would need to be replaced and the entire roof would be resurfaced. The lower roofs were found to be in bad condition and would need to be replaced.

Resolution 2020-322: C. Swartz asked why it was necessary for the Schodack Town Board to designate the East Greenbush Town Board as lead agency for a zoning change within their own jurisdiction. Atty. Langlois said under the SEQR review for zoning changes, a municipality was required to notify any neighboring towns if the change was close to the town border. S. Harris added that the zoning change involved a church that was close to the border of Schodack and East Greenbush.
