Supervisor Harris called the March 11, 2021 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

#### Briefing on Agenda

S. Harris gave a brief summary of the resolutions. He commended Chief Hourigan and the Police Reform Committee for their hard work to create the "Plan" referenced in resolution 2021-104. He noted, once the resolution was approved, the "Plan" would be filed with the NYS Division of Budget. For resolutions 2021-111 and 2021-112, he explained that the town would be working in conjunction with Rensselaer County to extend the sewer line down Maple Hill Road.

Regarding resolution 2021-115, the Supervisor asked Atty. Langlois to explain the Article 78 received against the Building Department. Atty. Langlois stated the Article 78 had been received by the Town Clerk's Office earlier in the week regarding notices of violation for a property located on Staats Island Road by the Schodack Building Department and Rensselaer County Department of Health. He said the property owner was attempting to evict tenants who had a trailer parked at the location, due to failure of the septic system (and non-compliance with both entities); however, he was not successful. The owner was now facing fines and wished to exercise his right to a trial before paying. Under the resolution, Girvin & Ferlazzo, P.C. would represent the town and submit a formal response to the claim. Based on the evidence, he did not feel it was a significant issue for the town.

All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

#### Board Comment: None.

Public Comment: The Town Clerk stated no public comment had been received via email.

**Departmental Reports:** The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Building Department, Historian, Tax Receiver, and Town Clerk.

**Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments:** The Board reviewed claims #21-0304 to 21-0486 on Abstract No. 2021-03 in the amount of \$747,643.10, including the claims paid (\$134,540.84) since the previous town board meeting.

Castleton Consolidated Sewer District -Extension No. 1 PROPOSED DISTRICT DESCRIPTION

BEGINNING AT A POINT located on the northerly right of way on Maple Hill Road at its intersection with New York State Route 9, said point also being the south east property corner of Tax Map Parcel No. (Parcel No.) 200-9-14.

THENCE westerly along the northerly boundary of Maple Hill Road to its intersection with the easterly boundary of Midstate Lane;

THENCE continuing northerly along said easterly boundary of Midstate Lane to a point; said point being the most southerly corner to Parcel No. 200-9-21.2,

THENCE continuing northerly and easterly along the bounds of Parcel No. 200-9-14 to the point of intersection with the westerly bounds of New York State Route 9;

THENCE southerly along said bounds of New York State Route 9 to the point and place of beginning.

Intending to describe the proposed Castleton Consolidated Sewer District -Extension No. 1. All tax parcel information is as of January 1, 2021.

WHEREAS, the proposed improvements to be constructed consist, inter alia, of 100 linear feet of 8 inch gravity sewer, 3 sanitary manholes, 7,500 linear feet of 6 inch PVC forcemain, 7,500 linear feet of 2 inch PVC forcemain, 2 forcemain flushing stations, 2 air relief manholes, 120 linear feet of 24 inch steel sleeve, 300 linear feet of 18 inch HDPE Sleeve, pump station and backfill; and

**WHEREAS**, the maximum amount proposed to be expended for the creation of the sewer district extension is One Million Eight Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand and 00/100 (\$1,875,000.00) Dollars; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 209(f) of the Town Law, approval of the New York State Comptroller will not be required for establishing this sewer district extension since debt shall not be issued or assumed by the town for any improvements and further since the cost of improvements will be paid for in full by Rensselaer County; and

**WHEREAS,** said map, plan and report describing said improvements is on file in the Town Clerk's Office for public inspection; and

**WHEREAS,** the typical property shall not incur any capital costs during the first year, and shall be assigned 2 Equivalent Dwelling Units based both upon water use of 200 gallons per day; and

**WHEREAS,** the first-year cost of full operation and maintenance for the typical property is Eight Hundred Eighty and 00/100 (\$880.00) Dollars with operation and maintenance charges determined on a benefit basis; and

WHEREAS, the connection fee in the amount of Two Hundred Seventy-Five and 00/100 (\$275.00) Dollars will be charged by the Town of Schodack to the property owner and a Five Thousand and 00/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollar capacity charge will be charged by the Village of Castleton-on-Hudson to the property owner.
