Supervisor Harris called the June 10, 2021 Town Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

Raised in Johnstown, New York a small Town much like our own, William attended and graduated from Fulton County Community College and the State University of New York at Brockport. During his college career William was a scholar-athlete competing in track and field.

Following an extensive psychological and background investigation William was selected for his strong background in public service, work ethic and calm - assuring demeanor.

We look forward to William joining our Team and continuing our mission to provide the highest level of service to the residents and visitors of Schodack."

After the introduction, Officer Johnson, accompanied by his fiancé Kristen, was asked to approach the dais for the oath of office to be administered by the Town Clerk and a brief pinning ceremony to commence.

### Public Comment

Alyssa Mitchum, a Trustee for the Castleton Library, thanked the board for their continued support of the Castleton Library and gave a brief summary of programs and other activities that would be offered from the library for the summer. She noted the summer reading program was designed to prevent students from falling into the summer slump, losing gains achieved and sought to help students improve reading skills and excel for the following school year. The library also offered other programs, such as the thousand books before kindergarten, to encourage younger readers to develop their skills; Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) kits; art and craft kits and adult reading programs. She added, to ensure the safety of all who attend, all summer activities at the library would be conducted outside on the lawn.

### Briefing of Resolution Agenda

S. Harris gave a brief overview of the resolutions. He noted an amendment was needed to resolution 2021-171 as the position of Park Attendant was part-time, not full-time. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

**Board Comment:** C. Bult questioned if the flooring estimate included the cost of installation. D. Kelly said no, the board would need to contract with an installer at an added cost (2021-163).

**Public Comment:** S. Harris asked if any public comment had been received via email. The Town Clerk said no.

**Departmental Reports:** The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Building Department, Tax Receiver and Town Clerk.

**Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments:** The Board reviewed claims #21-0852 to #21-0996 on Abstract No. 2021-06 in the amount of \$243,866.47, including the claims paid prior (\$102,953.11).

### Open Discussion

Judge Mullahy informed the board of a change that was needed for the Justice Court. He had been contacted by the Office of Court Administration regarding the security of the computers and internet within the Schodack Justice Court. Under their requirements, the office needed to disconnect from the town's server and be placed on their own, independent server. This would guard the office from any down time in the event of a ransomware attack on the town and protect all sensitive files maintained by the office. He said the Court System would work with the IT Person for the town to complete the conversion and all future maintenance would be conducted by a technician from the NYS Courts. S. Harris asked if there was a deadline for the conversion to be completed. Judge Mullahy gathered from his conversation with the Office of Court Administration that they wished the conversion to be done soon. They had informed him, once approval was given by the board and IT was brought up to speed, they could complete the change within the next few days. C. Bult asked if there was any cost to the town, other than the time for IT. Judge Mullahy said no. C. Bult asked if a resolution was needed for approval. Atty. Langlois said it was not necessary so long as all board members agreed to the change. All board members agreed.
