OTHERS PRESENT:

Supervisor Harris called the December 9, 2021 Town Board Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance and dispensed with roll call. All present as noted above.

S. Harris said a concern had arisen regarding proceeding with proposed Local Law 4-2021 (PLL4-2021), opting out of cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site consumption, as written. Atty. Langlois explained that, as the local law was drafted, the town board would have only two options regarding cannabis. They could either vote yes to opting out of allowing both retail dispensaries and on-site consumption or voting no to opt in to allow both. In the event the board voted yes but chose to rescind the local law in the future, both uses would have to be allowed. Based upon this issue, Atty. Langlois proposed withdrawing Proposed Local Law 4-2021 and schedule public hearings on December 29, 2021 for two new local laws that would separate out the uses (retail dispensaries and on-site consumption). These laws would be known as proposed Local Law 4-2021, opting out of cannabis on-site consumption and proposed Local Law 5-2021, opting out of cannabis retail dispensaries. He noted, if the board wished to withdraw the original Proposed Local Law 4-2021, there was no need to move forward with the public hearing scheduled for this evening and recommended that resolution 2021-296 be added to the agenda to formally withdraw PLL4-2021. C. Rex and C. Kenney both felt that, if the public hearing was no longer occurring, the public attending the meeting should still be allowed to share their comments regarding cannabis. Atty. Langlois and the other board members agreed.

Briefing of the Agenda

The Supervisor gave a brief summary of the resolutions. He noted, as proposed Local Law 4-2021 had been withdrawn, the same would be for resolution 2021-282. Atty. Langlois read the drafted resolutions for proposed Local Laws 4-2021 and 5-2021. Resolutions 2021-297 and 2021-298 were added to schedule public hearings regarding the aforementioned proposed local laws. All other resolutions were self-explanatory.

Board Comment: None.

Departmental Reports: The following monthly departmental reports were read and/or posted and filed in the Office of the Town Clerk: Building Department, Receiver of Taxes and Town Clerk.

Review of Abstracts of Claims and Budget Amendments: The Board reviewed claims #21-1954 to 21-2141 on Abstract No. 2021-12, in the amount of \$314,328.25, including the claims paid (\$148,669.87) since the previous town board meeting.

Public Comment (Resolutions & Open Comments)

Resolution 2021-284: N. Fuda informed the board that, based upon new state regulations, the town could no longer regulate mobile homes as they were viewed as stand alone homes. By inspecting mobile homes, the town was in violation of the law. She noted that a change had been included in the zoning code.

Cannabis: N. Fuda commended the board on their choosing to split the local law regarding cannabis into two separate laws. She noted that other municipalities who that had allowed retail sales of cannabis received a large sum of sales tax revenue. She felt that the town could also benefit from the sales tax, potentially allowing for the elimination of property taxes. She recommended setting fees to regulate as well.

K. Anandha of OM Shanti Yoga & Healing Arts felt retail dispensaries for cannabis could help support other businesses in the area.

L. McNamara also commended the board for splitting the cannabis legislation into two local laws. She felt it would be positive for the town moving forward.

Castleton Library: L. Knaack, a trustee of the Castleton Library, informed the board of the

adapted programs, modified based upon COVID regulations, that the Library offers to card holders. These programs include a walking story time at the Schodack Island State Park; drop-in fun activities offered at staggered times to limit large gatherings; craft kits for all ages of children and teens; and adults activities such as online American Sign Language classes and book clubs.
